Objective: Reflect on the purpose of injustice, within God's plan of redemption..

Icebreaker:

Have you ever wanted to follow someone's example? From whom and why??

To Start:

1. - Let us briefly share some of our notes and/or our reflections derived from last Sunday's teaching in "Semilla Online", 1 Peter 2:18-25
2. - Let's review this week's memorization together and then two or three volunteers say our memory verses.

To Observe:

- 1.- Let's read verses 18 to 20 in the NASB version and in two more versions; then let's take two minutes for each participant to make our own paraphrase of these three verses.
- 2.- How did the Lord behave in the face of injustice and how does he expect us to do so? Let's read and discuss verses 21 to 23.
- 3.- What are the blessings that should occupy our minds and our hearts when suffering injustice? Let's make a list of all the blessings that appear in verses 24 and 25 and discuss it.



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For Reflection:

1.- How does the fact that God wants to use you to show his love to your enemies make you feel? (Surprised, disappointed, angry, hopeful, grateful, other...)

2.- What can you do this week to "follow in the footsteps of Jesus" in your dealings with those from whom you receive rejection, criticism and injustice because of your faith?

3.- What could you be more grateful for right now: For Jesus' guidance or protection? Which do you need more?

Memorization:

1 Peter 2:21-25

²¹ To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps.

²² "He committed no sin,
and no deceit was found in his mouth."^[a]

²³ When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. ²⁴ "He himself bore our sins" in his body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; "by his wounds you have been healed." ²⁵ For "you were like sheep going astray," but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.
