MATTHEW 4:1-11

When Jesus was tempted

- 1.- He was guided by the Spirit.....(1-2)
- 2.- He was sustained by the scriptures.....(3-4)
- 3.- He was protected in perfect communion.....(5-7)
- 4.- He was happy in worship and service to God..... (8-11)

Objective: To be able to answer through the temptation of Jesus the question: Who are the people of God and how do they behave?

Icebreaker: When do you think you are most vulnerable: When you are under pressure, when you are stressed, when you are alone, after a day of intense communion with God, when you're hungry, another?

To start:

- 1.- Let's go over the memory verses together (Matthew 4:3,4)
- 2.- Let us briefly share some of our notes and/or our reflections derived from Last's Sundays teaching "When Jesus was tempted" (Matthew 4:1-11).

To Observe:

- 1.- How many things can we learn from Jesus's fast in verses 1 to 3? Let's make a list together and talk.
- 2.- What opinion does Jesus have of "the word of God" according to verses 3 and 4?
- 3.- What relationship do you find between the text that the devil quoted to Jesus (Psalm 91:11,12) with the text that Jesus quoted to the devil (Deuteronomy 6:16) in verses 5 to 7?

4.- Let's read verses 8 to 11 to discover and discuss what life is about when you live it "in the style of Jesus".

To Reflect:

- 1.- What would you say is the biggest temptation you are facing right now?
- 2.- What role does "the word of God" play in your daily routine and/or lifestyle?
- 3.- What is the doubt or the need that you have had for the longest time?
- 4.- What is more difficult for you: to obey God, trust him or live your life for him?
